Anti-Semitism today: challenges and perspectives

Anti-Semitism is an ancient phenomenon that still has an impact on social dynamics. States and supranational organizations have recognized the need to address and counter this phenomenon, which takes new forms today thanks to the development of recent technologies. Despite the enactment of legislation and law enforcement policies, anti-Semitism remains a complex and multifaceted issue, and its challenges persist in both explicit and subtle forms that are difficult to recognize. This call aims to critically examine the phenomenon of anti-Semitism, promoting reflection aimed at exploring, as possible lines of research, historical-legal perspectives, law enforcement legislation, the role of educational institutions, the intersections between anti-Semitism and other forms of discrimination, and the challenges posed by digital platforms. We, therefore, invite researchers and experts from but not limited to the legal field, to contribute with their analyses to this critical discussion.

For reasons of competence, issue no. 2 does not publish mere jurisprudential reviews.

SUBMISSIONS

The editorial committee will only consider for publication articles that have not been and will not be published elsewhere (in any format) and which comply with the journal's style guidelines. Interested authors are kindly invited to use the attached file "Style model". Only articles of a maximum of 15 pages will be accepted.

The editorial committee welcomes articles in Italian, English, French, and Spanish. Authors submitting an article in a language different from their mother tongue are responsible for any language review that may be necessary.

The article submission **must be preceded** by a manifestation of interest sent to the email address redazione.qdpe2@gmail.com by September 30, 2023.

The manifestation of interest must include:

- Name and Surname
- affiliation, if any
- title of the contribution that you intend to submit
- abstract of max 400 words

Contributions sent without prior manifestation of interest will not be considered.

All articles will be subject to blind peer review and authors will be notified of the reviewer's recommendation (accepted / accepted subject to change / rejected). Accepted articles will be published in the section "Contributions of the call for papers «Anti-Semitism today: challenges and perspectives»" of issue no. 2 of the journal, which will be published in October 2024 in both print and online versions.
